



Vaccinations

We can vaccinate horses for Tetanus, Equine Influenza (Flu) and Equine Herpes Virus. Each have their own rules as to when each injection is due next.

Equine Influenza (Flu) must adhere strictly to rules, whether these are Jockey Club, British Eventing or any other umbrella. Whilst Tetanus is a little less strict, we encourage our clients to stay within our recommendations for their horse's cover. We also suggest that the horse has a couple of quiet days after vaccinations, especially for flu.

Tetanus

A course of 3 vaccines is required before the horse would go onto biannual booster vaccine. Horses must be over 6 months old before can start the vaccination course. Foals younger than 6 months should have tetanus antitoxin to cover them until they can start the tetanus course.

1st injection given.

2nd Injection is due 4 -6 weeks after the first.

3rd Injection is due 6 months after the second.

Every 2 years for booster vaccinations.

Equine Influenza (Flu) and Equine Influenza (Flu) and Tetanus (combined)

A course of 3 vaccines is required before the horse would go onto an annual vaccine. Horses must be over 6 months old before can start the vaccination course.

1st injection is given.

2nd injection is due between 21 and 92 days after the first.

3rd injection is due between 150 and 215 days after the second.

Annual vaccinations (365 days) On or before the date it's due.

FEI regulations rule that horses competing must be vaccinated every 6 months. (21 days before or after the due date)

Equine Herpes Virus (EHV)

A course of 3 vaccines is required if the owner is wanting their horse vaccinated against EHV. Horses must be over 5 months old before we can start the vaccination course. Broodmares are recommended to be vaccinated during pregnancy.

For Vaccinating:

1st injection is given.

2nd Injection is due between 4-6 weeks after the first.

3rd Injection is due 6 months after the second.

Every 6 months for booster vaccinations.

For Broodmares:

Injections are due at 5, 7 and 9 months of pregnancy.

Rota Virus

We recommend broodmares (particularly those foaling away at stud) are vaccinated against Rota Virus. Injections are due at 8,9 and 10 months of pregnancy.

Stallions are also vaccinated for EVA. Please discuss with the vet regarding these.
